Book Name: 'Where the Red Fern Grows'



Style of Poetry

The style of a poem can be varied, depending on the form and the poet's intention. However, a common style for many poems includes the following elements:

- ★ **Title:** Title of the poem should be brief and should give the readers a hint about the poem's subject or tone.
- ★ Stanzas: Stanza is a group of lines that form the basic metrical unit in a poem. The number of lines in each stanza and the number of stanzas in a poem can vary, depending on the form and style of the poem.
- * Rhyme Scheme: A rhyme scheme is the pattern of rhymes at the end of each line of a poem or song. This can range from simple rhyming patterns to complex ones, and it is used to create musicality and unity in a poem.
- ★ Meter: The rhythmical pattern of stressed and unstressed syllables in verse of a poem. Different types of meters, such as iambic pentameter or trochaic meter can create different moods and effects in a poem.
- ★ Line Length: Line length can be varied, but it is often determined by meter and poet's intention. Short lines can create a sense of calm and contemplation.
- ★ Figures of Speech: Figures of speech, such as simile, metaphor and personification are used to add flavour to the writing and makes it so much more enjoyable for the readers. These literary devices can also help to create vivid images and emotions in the reader's mind.
- ★ Conclusion: The conclusion of a poem should bring the poem to a close, wrapping up the subject matter and leaving the reader with a sense of completion. This can be done through a final stanza, a resolution of the poem's central theme or final image of a poem.

This is a general style that many poems follow, but there are many forms and styles of poetry that may differ from this format. The structure of a poem will serve the poem's purpose and will be used to enhance the poem's meaning and impact.
